





### Strategy 3: Build a Community

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>B</sup> Examples are rape, sexual assault, sexual conduct with a minor, indecent exposure.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>c</sup>Examples are burglary, arson, larceny, motor vehicle theft.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>d</sup> Examples are possession, use, sale or furnishing of a drug or intoxicating substance or drug paraphernalia prohibited by law.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>e</sup> Examples are possession, carrying, use, sale, or manufacture of weapons prohibited by law.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> Excludes motor vehicle theft; examples are driving under the influence of alcohol, driving with license revoked, driving resulting in an accident/injury, and reckless driving.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>8</sup> Most common other case outcomes include restitution and court fees.

## How we get there



#### Prevention
